Voter's Guide to Town of Osoyoos Candidates

On October 17, 2026 the Town of Osoyoos will be conducting a general local election for:

Mayor – One (1) to be elected

Councillor – Four (4) to be elected

For a 4 (four) year term November 2026 – November 2030

Elections will also be held in Osoyoos water systems 8 and 9 for:

Water Councillor – Two (2) to be elected

For a 4 (four) year term November 2026 – November 2030

Voting Opportunities:

General voting day will be: **Saturday, October 17, 2026**

Advance voting days will be: **Wednesday, October 7, 2026 & Saturday, October 10, 2026**

All voting will take place at the Sonora Community Centre, 8505 – 68th Avenue, Osoyoos, BC, 8:00 am to 8:00 pm.

Note that **voting for Water Councillors** will also be conducted at Sonora Centre during these times, but is only open to RDOS residents living in and receiving water services from systems 8 and 9.

Mail Ballots will be available to eligible electors who cannot attend the advance or general voting days. Applications for Mail Ballots will be accepted starting on September 28, 2026. Application forms for resident and non-resident property electors will be available online at www.osoyoos.ca/council/elections or in-person at Town Hall, 8707 Main Street, Osoyoos BC, Monday to Friday, 9:00 am – 4:00 pm, excluding statutory holidays.

Voting Eligibility:

There is no need to pre-register to vote as the registration of all electors for this election will take place at the time of voting. You will be required to make a declaration that you meet the following requirements:

- be 18 years of age or older on general voting day (October 17, 2026);
- be a Canadian citizen;
- be a resident of BC for at least 6 months immediately preceding the day of registration (at time of voting);
- be a resident of the municipality OR have been the registered owner of real property in the municipality for at least 30 days immediately preceding voting day; and
- not be disqualified under the Local Government Act or any other enactment from voting in an election and or otherwise disqualified by law.

Resident electors must produce 2 documents of identification (at least one with a signature). Picture identification is not necessary. The identification must prove both residency and identity.

Non-resident property electors must produce 2 documents of identification (at least one with a signature) to prove identity, as well as proof that they are entitled to register in relation to the property and, if there is more than one owner of the property, written consent from the majority of the property owners is required. Each of the candidates in the upcoming election were asked to provide a picture of themselves, along with up to 150 words to describe themselves and their platform. Profiles for each candidate follows in the order that they will appear on the ballot.

Candidates for the Office of Mayor

One (1) Mayor will be elected for a four year term, November 2026 - November 2030.

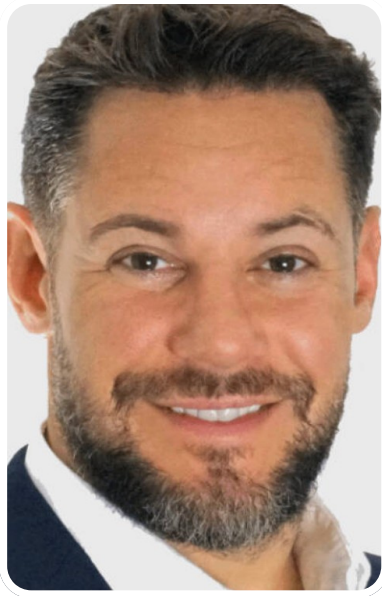

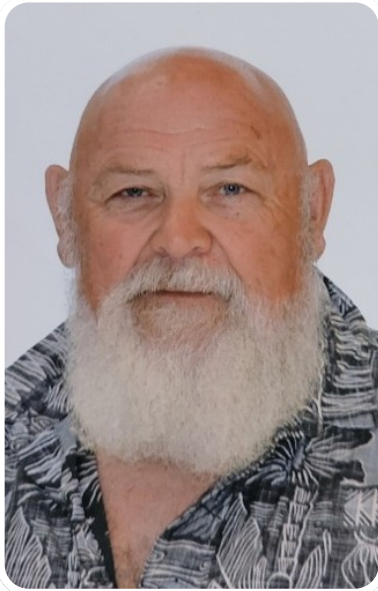


Bridget Wilson
